



#### **Hints for Your Postcards**

#### **Beaches**:

- Look for the Casuarina trees that line the shores, their needle-like leaves whispering in the sea breeze. These trees are commonly found along the coast, particularly in areas like Kappad, and are known for their salt tolerance.
- Visualise the graceful flight of Terns and Egrets, and other birds that thrive in the coastal environment.
- Imagine the rhythmic crashing of the Arabian Sea waves against the sands.
- Think about the local climate and how it affects the plants
   and animals you see.

#### Rivers (e.g., Chaliyar, Iravanjipuzha):

- Draw the lush green banks, where Mangroves provide a vital habitat.
- Listen for the calls of White-Throated Kingfisher as they dart across the water's surface.
- Consider the presence of various aquatic species that are part of the river ecosystem.

#### Trees:

- Depict jackfruit, palm, Indian rosewood, and other staple tree species of the region.
- Capture the vibrant colors of Malabar Parakeets or the elusive Malabar Grey Hornbill.
- Showcase the diverse flora, including various ferns and flowering plants, that create a rich biodiversity.
- Imagine the sounds of forested areas, including the sounds of various butterfly species, insects and mammals.






# Kozhikode Mapped

Kozhikode (formerly Calicut) has been a gateway to trade, culture, and history for centuries. From the arrival of Arab and Chinese merchants to Vasco da Gama's first steps on Indian soil, the city has been shaped by the people who passed through its shores. Its streets, markets, and monuments hold stories of the past, waiting to be explored.

In this activity, we will use a map to trace Kozhikode's historic sites. From the warehouses of Valiyangadi to the scenic Mananchira Square, from the shipbuilding hub of Beypore to the age-old mosques and temples, let's uncover the places that made Kozhikode a legendary port city.

#### Instructions

- Look at the list of historic locations provided.
- Match each location with its correct spot on the map.
- Draw a small icon or sketch to represent the landmark (e.g., a ship for Beypore, a mosque for Mishkal Mosque).

#### Locations to be Marked

1. Mananchira Square – The historic tank or pond once used by the Zamorin rulers, now a cultural hub with gardens and iconic buildings surrounding it.

- 2. Mishkal Mosque An over 600-year-old wooden mosque built by an Arab merchant, showcasing Indo-Islamic architecture.
- 3. Beypore Famous for making Uru, traditional wooden ships that were once used for the Indian Ocean trade
- 4. Mittai Theruvu (Sweet Street) A busy market street known for its famous Kozhikode Halwa and snacks.
- 5. Kozhikode Beach A historic trade port, now a popular place for sunsets, street food, and literature festivals.
- 6. Tali Temple A 14th-century Hindu temple, known for its traditional Kerala temple architecture.
- 7. Kuttichira A historic area with old mosques like Mishkal and Muchundi, reflecting Kozhikode's Islamic heritage.
- 8. Comtrust Weaving Factory A British-era textile factory, founded by the Basel Mission, known for its high-quality handwoven fabrics.
- 9. Freedom Square A cultural space near Mananchira that hosts events and celebrates Kerala's history.
- 10. Valiyangadi An old market and trading center that is a key part of Kozhikode's commerce.

#### A. KOZHIKODE THROUGH TIME

- 1498 Portuguese explorer Vasco da Gama landed at Kappad, opening the sea route to India for European traders.
- 2. 1766 Hyder Ali of Mysore captures Calicut.
- 3. 1848 BEM Higher Secondary School was founded by the Basel Evangelical Mission.
- 4. 1891 The Town Hall near Mananchira was built to commemorate the anniversary of Queen Victoria's reign.
- 5. 1923 The influential newspaper Mathrubhumi was established.
- 1938 Radha Theatre, one of the earliest singlescreen cinemas in Kozhikode, is established on SM Street.
- 7. 1980 SK Pottekkatt wins the Jnanpith Award for literature, the first from Kerala to receive the honour.
- 1994 Kozhikode hosts the first International Film Festival of Kerala (IFFK), commemorating 100 years of cinema.
- 2023 Kozhikode is officially designated as a UNESCO City of Literature, recognizing its literary contributions.
- 10. 2024 Calicut FC wins the first-ever Super League Kerala championship at EMS Corporation Stadium.
