- 4. It is part of local cuisine cooked only in a specific geographical landscape.
- 5. It requires traditional cooking tools, utensils, or methods that are not commonly used today.

Rules:

- 1. The recipe must mention ingredients, detailed instructions, and a list of traditional utensils/tools used, if any.
- 2. Entries should be submitted in English and be between 300 and 600 words.
- 3. Participants are expected to have the ability to shoot themselves cooking.
- 4. Submit your entries on or before September 16, 2021. Applications that do not adhere to the first two rules will, unfortunately, not be considered.

Selection Criteria:

The best three entries will be selected based on their uniqueness and relevance to the theme.

Prizes:

One lucky contestant will win a set of measuring spoons made of pure copper. Two other participants will each win an Amazon voucher worth INR 1,000. Winners will get a chance to showcase their culinary skills at Sahapedia's Culture For All Festival 2021.
